**Date:** July 7, 2019 **Text:** Acts 21:1-14

**Title:** Embracing Suffering or Stifling the Spirit?

Big Idea: Followers of Jesus should faithfully obey even through suffering because Jesus is

worth it.

## Read Acts 20:22-24 & 21:1-14

Three themes: Obedience, Endurance, Devotion

- 1. **Obedience:** We must obey the Holy Spirit even when we hear competing voices.
  - God's will for Paul was very difficult, but he was *constrained* by the Spirit (see Acts 20:22). How did he know God's will for him (see Acts 9:16, 20:23 & 21:11)?
  - What voices do we tend to listen to instead of God's when we make decisions about how God is leading us?
  - If we are to be obedient to God's leading, what does this require from us? How do we discern God's will for us?
  - It surprises us that "the will of the Lord" would be suffering, and it is a hard-fought battle to get to the place in our own lives where we submit to it in obedience to Christ.
  - Acts 21:4 implies that the Spirit was leading the believers to urge Paul not to go to Jerusalem, but what is most likely happening here is that the believers are fulfilling Galatians 5:22-23 & 6:2 towards Paul. How so? What are some practical ways we can bear one another's burdens in the midst of their suffering?
- 2. Endurance: We must patiently endure suffering even when it doesn't make sense.
  - Suffering is inevitable in life, but especially in the Christian life. We are never promised an easy carefree life.
  - Read and reflect on the following passages: Luke 9:23-24; 1 Peter 3:8-4:2 and 4:12-19; James 1:2-4; Romans 5:3-5; Hebrews 12:1-11.
  - What kind of suffering is God asking you to endure?
- 3. **Devotion.** We must be devoted to Christ even when suffering comes our way.
  - What drove Paul to obey Christ and endure suffering? Consider the following passages: Acts 20:24; Philippians 3:8-14; Romans 8:18; 2 Corinthians 4:7-18 and 11:23-28.
  - Paul's life was devoted to the glory and enjoyment of his King. Reflect on your life—are
    you devoted to the glory and enjoyment of Jesus?
